Dear Michael Oak Parents & Guardians,

Welcome to a new and exciting year of sport and extramurals at Michael Oak. Please see the options for the term 1 offerings on the next few pages.

Registration

There is a requirement of one compulsory extramural per term. Sport and extramurals begin on the Monday, 27 January 2025 and end on Thursday, 3 April 2025. Please note that a minimum of 7 students (registered) is required for each sport/extramural to continue for the term. There will be no trial week and we would like to request that all registration forms are submitted by Friday, 24 January 2025. A revised version of the timetable will be sent thereafter. Make sure to only choose an activity that is allocated to your specific class.

- If you have more than one child at school, then you will need to fill in a separate form for each child.
- For a smooth-running programme, the best results and in the interests of security, please advise your child to choose activities they intend to commit to for the whole term.
- Please note that children who are not registered for a sport will not be allowed to participate until the online registration form has been submitted.

Cancelled sports and extramurals

If any changes or cancellations need to happen – such as in the case of inclement weather – parents/guardians will be informed as soon as possible via an SMS. Most activities do have an indoor backup in case of rain and will continue.

ALL PS and HS Sport is cancelled on Friday, 4 April due to the Dads, Dudes and Kids Camp and HS Sports Day.

Billing

Children may join as many extra murals as they wish. The first activity is INCLUDED in school fees. Each additional activity will be <u>billed at R400 for the term</u>. (Discount of 10% for 3rd and 20% for 4th and 5th activities. Marimba is billed directly to parents by Marimba Jam and is R980 per student, per term. - Some activities, such as Art Classes, are run by external facilitators, and booking and payment are to be done directly with the facilitator. See information below.

EXTRAMURAL ART CLASSES AT MICHAEL OAK 1st TERM 2025

The much-loved art classes will be held at Michael Oak on Fridays and Saturdays (times below). The venue is a beautiful classroom near the high school garden. Children can come to the classroom for art straight after school or other extramural activities, and wait under guidance (eat their lunch, read or draw), or join the art class. They may arrive a little late after class or other extramurals if needed.

What we did in the 3rd/4th terms: Our projects were sketching, drawing or painting shoes in connection with the Elders' Mandela #WalkTogether campaign; clay sculptures inspired by Picasso's ceramics and/or the shoe project; colour planning painted sketches when the sculptures were fired; as well as story pictures created around the modelled items. Eco- and artist-friendly painting and varnishing of the fired sculptures followed, and then sketching/free work using crushed real spring flowers as paint, some combined with chalk pastels. We went on to watercolours with real mica in it with a special sparkle. Beautiful! Additional sketches, artworks and sculptures were also created. See accompanying pictures (the first in the high school garden).



Projects for the 1st term: These will be chosen from: paper mâché functional artworks including creating an artistic pottery item; marine theme collages using etching, seaweed, shells, inks etc; portraits and landscapes using artist Maggie Loubser's artworks on exhibition at Norval Art Museum to inspire in a current way; preparation for painting on canvas; as well as outings to artists' studios and to Norval. Projects are age appropriate, with interesting introductions. Do put in requests.

Fees include materials and firing, and are R1200 per term. Pro rata fees for late joiners after the second lesson. Visitors or 'try-out' pupils are welcome at R160 per lesson.
